Unprecedented rise in LPG prices: Govt seeks to make JJVL LPG plant operational

ISLAMABAD: Amid an unprecedented rise in the price of LPG cylinder of 11.8 kg that currently stands at Rs2,436 as per OGRA's latest notification, which may further rise during the forthcoming winter season on account of increasing demand and supply gap, the Petroleum Division has geared up its endeavors to revive the Jamshoro Joint Venture Limited LPG and NGL extraction plant. This will not only scale down the LPG prices but also reduce reliance on imports.
